AN ACT Relating to Placing Objects on Utility Poles Without Consent.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 131, § 16-A, additional. Chapter 131 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 16-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 16-A. Placing objects on utility poles. Whoever, without the prior consent of the utility owning or using the pole, places any poster, bill or advertisement, tack, nail or other object on any utility pole, whether or not within the limits of a public way, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.’
