AN ACT Relating to Catching of Lobsters by Skindivers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 68-A, sub-§ III, additional. Section 68-A of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 204 of the public laws of 1961, is amended by adding a new subsection III, to read as follows:

‘III. Exception if lobsters caught by skindivers. It shall be lawful for skindivers, as that term is commonly used, to catch up to, but not exceeding, 10 lobsters per day by hand without the assistance of catching instruments of any kind for noncommercial purposes only.’
