IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Loss of Pauper Settlement.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 94, § 3, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 3 of chapter 94 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Whenever a person of capacity to acquire a settlement, having a pauper settlement in a town, has lived or shall live for 5 consecutive years in any unincorporated place or places in the State, or 5 consecutive years outside of the town in which he has a settlement after August 1, 1926, ~~without receiving pauper supplies from any source within the State~~ he and those who derive their settlement from him lose their settlement in such town ~~and whenever~~. **Whenever** a person of capacity to acquire a settlement having a pauper settlement in any town in the State shall after April 29, 1893 ~~also~~ live for 5 consecutive years beyond the limits of the State ~~without receiving pauper supplies from any source within the State~~, he and those who derive their settlement from him shall lose their settlement in such town.'
