SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 974, L. D. 1302, Bill, "An Act Requiring Persons Seventy-five Years of Age to take Biennial Examination for Motor Vehicle Driver's License."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the Title and inserting in place thereof the following Title: 'An Act Relating to Persons Seventy-five Years of Age Taking Examination for Motor Vehicle Driver's License.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

" 'Any person who has reached his 75th birthday and who has not taken an examination to qualify him to operate a motor vehicle within the past year shall be required to pass a driver's examination before a license may be issued to him; except that any person who applies for and receives a license to operate a motor vehicle effective on his 74th birthday shall not be required to take such examination until and unless he applies for renewal thereof to be effective on his 76th birthday. Any person who secures a motor vehicle operator's license at either age 75 or 76, as detailed, must pass a driver's examination at such times thereafter as he shall apply for renewal thereof.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall take effect on January 1, 1964. "
