SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S. P. 472, L. D. 1324, Bill, "An Act
Permitting Selectmen of Certain Municipalities to Act
as Voting Registrars."

Amend said Bill by striking out the Title and inserting in place
thereof the following Title: 'An Act Relating to Appeals from
Registrars of Voters.'

Further amend said Bill in the 5th and 6th lines by striking
out the underlined words and figure "of more than 2,500 population"

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the underlined
last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following underlined
sentences: 'If any person is aggrieved by the decision of a
registrar of voters, he may appeal in writing to the municipal
officers of a municipality by filing a complaint therefor. The
municipal officers shall forthwith fix a time and place for immediate
hearing. After hearing, the municipal officers may affirm, modify
or reverse the decision of the registrar of voters. Appeal by such
aggrieved person from the decision of the municipal officers to the
District Court may be taken in accordance with the rules of civil
procedure.'
