SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S. P. 478, L. D. 1330, Bill, "An Act to Establish and Regulate Commercial Driver Education Schools and Instructors."

Amend said Bill by adding after that part designated "Sec. 65-B." of section 1 a new section to read as follows:

' Sec. 65-B-1. Insurance for school. The Secretary of State shall not issue a license for a commercial driver education school until the applicant therefor shall have procured and filed with the Secretary of State a certificate showing that the applicant is covered by an automobile bodily injury and property damage liability insurance policy providing coverage as set forth in this chapter, approved by the Insurance Commissioner, insuring against any legal liability in accordance with the terms of said policy for personal injury or death of any one person in the sum of \$25,000 and for any number of persons in the sum of \$50,000 and against property damage in the sum of \$10,000, which injury, death or damage may result from or have been caused by the operation of any vehicle being used in carrying out sections 65-A to 65-I. In lieu of such insurance, the applicant may file with said Secretary of State a bond or bonds issued by a surety company authorized to do business in the State in the amount of at least \$25,000 on account of injury to or death of any one person, and subject to such limits as respects injury to or death of one person, of at least \$50,000 on account of any one accident resulting in injury to or death of more than one person, and of at least \$10,000 for damage to property of others.

The Secretary of State shall suspend, without hearing, such license within 10 days of receipt of written notice from the company that the insurance policy or bond herein required has been canceled. He shall likewise suspend said license upon the expiration of the policy and shall not restore same until new certification of coverage is filed by the company.'
