STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Exempting Certain Personnel of Department of Economic Development from Personnel Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38-A, § 2, amended. The first paragraph of section 2 of chapter 38-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 471 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

‘The commissioner may employ, **with the approval of the Governor and Council**, such division chiefs, deputies, assistants and ~~employees as may be necessary~~ **may employ such clerical assistants**, subject to ~~the provisions of~~ the Personnel Law, ~~as may be necessary~~; employ or engage with the approval of the Governor and Council such outside technical or professional consultants as may be necessary or appropriate to assist the department in carrying out its functions; and may enter into contracts with other boards, commissions, departments and divisions of the State or with the University of Maine to assist him or any divisions of the department in carrying out ~~the provisions of~~ this chapter.’
