IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Creating a Governor's Committee on Economic Development.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 38-A, § 7, repealed and replaced. Section 7 of chapter 38-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 471 of 1955, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 7. Governor's Committee on Economic Development. There shall be a Governor's Committee on Economic Development to consist of the Governor and 50 public members appointed by the Governor, of whom there shall be 2 residents appointed from each county and the remainder appointed at large of such persons as shall reflect as nearly a representative cross-section of the economy of the State as is practicable. The public members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, except that at the first appointment under this section of the members appointed to represent each county, one shall be appointed for a term of 2 years and one shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, and thereafter all members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years. The Governor shall fill any vacancy for the unexpired term.

The members of the committee shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The committee shall meet upon the call of the Governor and shall study and make such recommendations as it may deem appropriate and necessary relative to the economic, industrial and recreational development of this State. The heads of the respective departments and agencies of the State shall cooperate fully with the committee in carrying out the purposes of this section.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 38-A, § 8, repealed. Section 8 of chapter 38-A of the Re-

vised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 471 of the public laws of 1955, is repealed.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. Any appropriations made by the Legislature to the Advisory Board, Department of Economic Development, shall be transferred to the Governor's Committee on Economic Development.
