STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Designating the General Election as a Legal Holiday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 41, § 154, amended. The first sentence of section 154 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 22 of chapter 395 of the public laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

‘The following days shall be observed as school holidays, namely: Patriot’s Day, April 19th; Memorial Day, May 30th; Independence Day, July 4th; Labor Day, first Monday in September; **the day of the State election**; Veterans Day, November 11th; Christmas Day, December 25th; Thanksgiving and Arbor Day, as appointed by the Governor and Council.’

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 59, § 155, amended. Section 155 of chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 28 of chapter 395 of the public laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

‘**Sec. 155. Bank holidays.** Any day of public thanksgiving, appointed by the Governor and Council or by the President of the United States, the first day of January, the 22nd day of February, the 19th day of April, the 30th day of May, the 4th day of July, the first Monday of September, **the day of the State election**, Veterans Day, November 11th, and the 25th day of December are declared to be bank holidays. If a bank holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be deemed a bank holiday for the purposes of this chapter.’
