IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Number of Signatures on Nomination Papers for Town Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 90-A, § 37, sub-§ III, amended. The first sentence of subsection III of section 37 of chapter 90-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 405 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

The nomination for any office shall be made by nomination papers signed by at least the following number of voters based on the population of the town according to the last decennial census of the United States: not less than 25 nor more than 75 in towns of 1,000 or less population; not less than 50 nor more than 100 in towns of 1,001 to 4,000; not less than 75 nor more than 125 in towns of 4,001 to 10,000; and not less than 100 nor more than 150 in towns of more than 10,000.
