STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Probation of Persons by Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 27-A, § 6, sub-§ II, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection II of section 6 of chapter 27-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 387 and as repealed and replaced by section 2 of chapter 428, both of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:
 - **'A.** When a person is convicted of an offense which is punishable by imprisonment and a fine, or by imprisonment, or by both, the court may sentence him to a fine and a term of imprisonment, suspend execution of the imprisonment, and place him on probation as to the imprisonment on condition that he pay the fine within a definite time. In default of payment of the fine, the court may impose an additional sentence of not more than 6 months.'
