HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 529, L.D. 1450, Resolve, Proposing
an Amendment to the Constitution to Revise Article VI
Relating to the Judicial Power.

Amend said Resolve by striking out all of underlined section
6 and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Section 6. Judges of probate shall be elected by the people
of their respective counties, by a plurality of the votes given in,
at the biennial election on the Tuesday following the first Monday
of November, and shall hold their offices for four years, commencing
on the first day of January next after their election. Vacancies
occurring in said office by death, resignation or otherwise, shall
be filled by election in manner aforesaid at the November election,
next after their occurrence; and in the meantime, the Governor,
with the advice and consent of the Council, may fill said vacancies
by appointment, and the persons so appointed shall hold their
offices until the first day of January next after the election
aforesaid."
