SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1022, L. D. 1478, Bill, "An Act
Clarifying the Inland Fish and Game Laws."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of section 23 and
inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 23. R. S., c. 37, §97-A, repealed and replaced.

Section 97-A of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised,
is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 97-A. Use of artificial lights for lighting game.

It shall be unlawful to use artificial lights between 1/2 hour
after sunset and 1/2 hour before sunrise to illuminate, jack, locate,
attempt to locate or show up wild birds or animals during open
season on deer in any zone, except as provided in section 94, and
section 113, subsection IV; and except that during open season
for hunting deer with bow and arrow, persons not hunting deer shall
be permitted to use artificial lights to illuminate, locate, attempt
to locate or show up such wild birds and animals.'"
