SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1139, L. D. 1610, Bill, "An Act Authorizing the Municipalities of Bridgton and Harrison to Form a School Administrative District."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in place thereof the following:

'AN ACT Authorizing Certain Municipalities to Form School Administrative Districts.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 3rd line the words "the area" and inserting in place thereof the words 'certain areas'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 6th line the words "this area" and inserting in place thereof the words 'these areas'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 8th line the words "this proposed district" and inserting in place thereof the words 'these proposed districts'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 11th line the word "District" and inserting in place thereof the word 'Districts'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the 18th line the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill by adding before the emergency clause the following section:

'Sec. 2. School Administrative District for Cumberland and North Yarmouth authorized. The Municipalities of Cumberland and North Yarmouth are exempted from the limitations provided in the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 41, section 111-E, as amended, and the State Board of Education is authorized to proceed pursuant to said chapter 41, sections 111-F to 111-U-1, to take the necessary action to allow the Municipalities of Cumberland and North Yarmouth to form a School Administrative District.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit the number of times that the above-named municipalities may make application to the State Board of Education, nor shall the authority granted to the State Board of Education under this act be limited to any specified number of times for the board to authorize the above-named municipalities to act on the formation of a School Administrative District.'
