AN ACT Increasing Salaries of Members of Industrial Accident Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 31, § 29, amended. The first sentence of the 3rd paragraph of section 29 of chapter 31 of the Revised Statutes, as last amended by section 9 of chapter 361 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:

'The chairman shall receive a salary of ~~\$10,000~~ \$11,500 per year, and the other commissioners a salary of ~~\$9,000~~ \$10,500 each per year.'

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Industrial Accident Commission the sum of \$3,461 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964 and the sum of \$4,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 to carry out the purposes of this act.

Sec. 3. Effective date. It is the intention of the Legislature that the increase in salaries given in section 1 of this act shall be retroactive and effective as of September 21, 1963, and the chairman of the commission and the commissioners shall receive the salaries above set forth on and after said date, and that the appropriate state officials are authorized to make the necessary computation upon the effective date of this act and pay the chairman and the commissioners accordingly. The reason this increase is made retroactive to September 21, 1963, is that all other major state department heads, boards and commissions received salary increases during the regular session of the Legislature, which were effective on this date and this will treat the Industrial Accident Commission members on the same basis.
