## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Statements of Ministers, Priests and Rabbis as Privileged Communications.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 16, § 156, additional. Title 16 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 156 to read as follows:

'Sec. 156. Religious confessionals. An ordained minister of the gospel, priest or rabbi shall not be forced to testify in court, in civil or criminal proceedings, to statements made to him by a person under the sanctity of a formal act of religion or concerning a matter of conscience. The person entitled to the benefit of the penitent and clergyman privilege is the penitent. Such statements made under the sanctity of a formal act of religion or concerning a matter of conscience shall be deemed privileged communications and such privilege may not be waived.'
