STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Create a Committee to Study Effect of Foreign Labor in Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Committee. There is created a committee composed of 3 members, one to be appointed by the Governor, one Senator to be appointed by the President of the Senate and one Representative to be appointed by the Speaker of the House. The member appointed by the Governor shall be the chairman.
- Sec. 2. Duties. The committee shall study the importation of labor and equipment from foreign countries, particularly as such importation affects Maine's economy and labor supply, and shall report the results of its study to the 103rd Legislature.
- Sec. 3. Expenses. The members of the committee shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of its duties.
- Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$5,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. Any balance of this appropriation shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1967.
