STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Creating a Vocational Educational Institute in the Waterville Area of Kennebec County.

Vocational Educational Institute; appropriation for. Resolved: That the Department of Education is authorized and directed to establish, maintain and operate a State Vocational Educational Institute in such location in the Waterville area of Kennebec County as it deems best, to promote specialized training for those who give evidence of special aptitude or need and who desire specialized training designed specifically to train for service in trade, industry or commerce; and be it further

Resolved: That the Department of Education is authorized and empowered to receive such gifts and donations, either from public or private sources as may be offered unconditionally; and be it further

Resolved: That there is appropriated to the Department of Education from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$975,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$196,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 to carry out the purposes of this resolve. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACTS

There is a great need for vocational education in the Waterville area of Kennebec County, and the purpose of this resolve is to provide assistance to those in this area who need training for service in trade, industry and commerce.
