STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Reed Plantation for School Construction Aid.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Reed Plantation; school construction aid. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$50,000 to be paid to Reed Plantation as a hardship grant for school construction aid. Said sum shall be expended on school construction in the said Reed Plantation.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The situation in Wytopitlock is a serious one involving the schooling, safety and well-being of approximately 100 children in an isolated, poor area in this State. The people of Reed Plantation have been expending upwards of \$2,000 each year recently to try to keep the present building as safe and comfortable as possible. Their attempts to have the building completely renovated have been proven impractical. Though willing, they are unable to raise the necessary funds to provide the building they so need. This project should receive all aid possible toward its completion.
