RESOLVE, in Favor of Town of Bancroft.

Town of Bancroft; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$426.47 to be paid to the Town of Bancroft to reimburse them for supplies furnished to the William Baker family during 1957 and 1958.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Baker family has moved all over the place and apparently has no settlement in any town. During the first years of their stay in Bancroft the selectmen were trying to collect from the Town of Wade, this failed as the family had been away long enough to lose their residence there. Since then they have tried several other places and now believe they belong to the State of Maine. They tried to get this into the 101st Legislature, but were too late.
