STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Prohibiting the Marking of Absentee Ballots Before Certain Officials.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 1254, sub-§ 1, amended. The first sentence of subsection 1 of section 1254 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘When an absentee voter is within the State, he must mark his ballot in the presence of one of the following officials: Justice of the peace, notary public, clerk of courts, **provided such an official is not a candidate for office on that ballot.**’
