STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Extending Hunting Season.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 1952, amended. The last paragraph of section 1952 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is repealed as follows:

~~'Whenever the entire State is closed to hunting by proclamation of the Governor during the open season on deer, the commissioner with the consent of the Governor and Council is authorized to extend the open season for deer hunting for a period not to exceed the number of days lost.'~~

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 2353-A, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2353-A to read as follows:

'Sec. 2353-A. Extended deer and bird hunting season. Whenever a section or sections of the State are closed to hunting by proclamation of the Governor during the open season on deer or birds, the commissioner (Inland Fisheries and Game), after the proclamation has been annulled, with the consent of the Governor and Council, may extend the open season for deer hunting or bird hunting in such section or sections of the State for a period not to exceed the number of days lost.'
