STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing for Open Season on Bull Moose.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T, 12, § 2467, amended. The first paragraph of section 2467 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No person shall hunt, kill or have in his possession any caribou or moose, or parts thereof, except that there shall be an open season on bull moose from October 4th to October 11th, during which period any person legally licensed to hunt may hunt and kill one such moose provided such moose has not less than 2 prongs on one horn. All moose killed under this section shall be registered as provided for deer in section 2355 and all provisions of said section shall apply to moose killed under this section. In addition, the agents designated by the commissioner (Inland Fisheries and Game) shall tag each moose with a tag furnished by the commissioner on payment of \$50 from the person registering said moose. No person who has legally killed a caribou or moose beyond the limits of this State shall have in his possession or import such caribou or moose, or parts thereof, into this State, unless he has obtained a permit from the commissioner to import such caribou or moose, or parts thereof, for the purpose of consumption or for mounting, but not for sale. Such permit authorizing the importation of caribou or moose, or parts thereof, shall set forth the inclusive dates when such possession shall be legal.'
