STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Pedestrians on Ways After Dark.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 905, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 905 to read as follows:

'Sec. 905. After dark. Any pedestrian walking on a way during the period from $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset to $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise shall wear or display an identification which is white in color. Such identification shall be worn or displayed by the pedestrian on the side of his person which is nearest to approaching vehicles and shall be clearly discernible at a distance of 150 feet ahead.

Any person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not less than 10 days nor more than 30 days, or by both.'
