AN ACT Regulating the Digging of Clams in Wells, York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 154, Chapter A, § 4, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 4 of chapter A of chapter 154 of the private and special laws of 1959, as repealed and replaced by chapter 42 of the private and special laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

'III. License required to dig or take clams in Wells. No person shall, in the Town of Wells in the County of York, dig or take clams unless license has been granted to him by the municipal officers of said town, who are authorized to grant and issue such licenses and fix the fee therefor. No license shall be granted or issued except to a resident of ~~said town~~ **York County.**'
