STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD MINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Penalties under Dealer of Livestock Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 7, § 1308, amended. Section 1308 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1308. Penalties. Any person, copartnership, association or corporation engaged in the business of buying or selling livestock as defined in this chapter without a license provided for in section 1304, or who shall violate any of the provisions of sections 1302 to 1307, or any rule and regulation promulgated thereunder, or neglect or refuse to comply with any of the provisions thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 for the first offense and not more than \$500 for each subsequent offense \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.'
