STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Prohibiting Sunday Auctions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 260-A, additional. Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 260-A to read as follows:

‘Sec. 260-A. Sunday auctions prohibited. No person, firm or corporation shall on the Lord’s Day conduct any auction sale in this State.’

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 32, § 261, amended. Section 261 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 261. Penalties. Whoever conducts any auction sale in this State on the Lord’s Day or, without an auctioneer’s license, represents himself to be a licensed auctioneer or conducts any auction sale in this State, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.’
