STATE OF MAINE SENATE 102nd LEGISLATURE

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" 'to H. P. 147, L. D. 170, Bill, "An Act

Increasing Compensation of Councilmen of City of South
Portland."

Amend said Bill by adding at the end the following:

'Referendum; effective date. This Act shall take effect 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the City of South Portland at the next regular city election.

The city clerk shall prepare the required ballots, on which he shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question: "Shall the Act Increasing Compensation of Councilmen of City of South Portland, passed by the 102nd Legislature, be accepted?" The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

This Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof on January 1, 1966 upon its acceptance by a majority vote of the legal voters voting at said election; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at said election equaled or exceeded 20% of the total vote for all candidates for Governor in said city at the next preceding gubernatorial election.

The result of such election shall be declared by the municipal officers of the City of South Portland and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State.' Proposed by Senator SNOW of Cumberland
