IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Create a Recess Committee to Study Guardianship of Retarded Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Committee. The Governor shall appoint a Committee on Guardianship of Retarded Persons of not more than 5 persons and shall designate the chairman.

Sec. 2. Duties. The committee shall study the problems with respect to guardianship and custodial supervision of retarded persons, both in and out of state institutions.

Sec. 3. Meetings; expenses. Said committee shall meet at the call of the chairman and the members thereof shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 4. Report. The committee shall report the results of its study together with any recommended legislation to the 103rd Legislature.

Sec. 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 to carry out the purposes of this Act. Any unexpended balances shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1967.
