STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing for Hunting Certificates for Residents Between the Ages of 10 and 16.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2401, sub-§ 2-A, additional. Section 2401 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 2-A to read as follows:
- '2-A. Junior resident certificate. Any resident between the ages of 10 and 16 years may hunt wild birds and animals, provided he has first procured from the commissioner or his authorized agent a written certificate and provided he is accompanied at all times while hunting by a parent or guardian or by an adult approved by parent or guardian. Such certificate may be issued on payment of \$1.75, 25¢ to be retained by the town clerk or agent. No resident under the age of 10 years may hunt wild birds or animals with firearms at any time.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 2401, sub-§ 6, amended. The 2nd and 3rd paragraphs of subsection 6 of section 2401 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

'Any resident between the ages of 10 and 16 years may hunt with firearms without a license, if accompanied at all times while hunting by a parent or guardian or by an adult approved by parent or guardian.

No resident under the age of 10 years and no nonresident under the age of 12 years may hunt wild birds or animals with firearms at any time.'
