AN ACT Relating to Use of Live Bait in Cochnewagon Lake, Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 12, § 2558, amended. The first paragraph of section 2558 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

“It shall be unlawful to sell, use or have in possession, either dead or alive, for use as bait for fishing in the inland waters of this State any pickerel, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sunfish, crappie, hornpout, carp or any spiny-finned fish ; except that the use or possession of live bait, including yellow perch which have been caught at Little Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, the same day as used, shall be permitted in said Little Sebago Lake, **and except that the use or possession of live bait, including yellow perch and sunfish which have been caught at Cochnewagon Lake, the same day as used, shall be permitted in said Cochnewagon Lake, Kennebec County.**”
