STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting for Pheasants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2852, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2852, to read as follows:

'Sec. 2852. Hunting stamp. No person over 16 years of age shall take, hunt, kill or possess in the fields and forests or on the waters or ice of this State any pheasant unless, at the time of such taking, hunting, killing or possessing, such person carries on his person an unexpired stamp, validated, by his signature in ink, across the face of the stamp, prior to the time of taking, hunting, killing or possessing such pheasant. Any person to whom a stamp has been issued shall, immediately upon request, exhibit the stamp to any officer authorized to enforce the inland fish and game laws. Any person taking, hunting, killing or possessing in the fields and forests or on the waters or ice of this State any pheasant without such a stamp attached to his hunting license, or if a hunting license is not required, actually not on or about his person, shall be deemed to be without such stamp. Such stamp shall be issued upon the payment of \$1.50 to any duly authorized license agent of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game. Such stamp shall expire at midnight on December 31st of the year in which issued.'
