**AN ACT Prohibiting Taking of Fish as Bait in Certain Inland Waters.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2558, amended. Section 2558 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

‘It shall be unlawful to take or possess all fish for use as bait for fishing in the following waters:

1. Kennebec River. All tidal portions of the Kennebec River and all tidal portions of the tributaries of the Kennebec River in the municipalities of Augusta, Chelsea, Hallowell, Farmingdale, Gardiner, Randolph, Pittston, all in Kennebec County and Richmond, Bowdoinham, Topsham, Bath, West Bath, Phippsburg, Perkins Township, Woolwich, Arrowsic, Georgetown, all in Sagadahoc County and Dresden in Lincoln County.

2. Androscoggin River. All tidal portions of the Androscoggin River and tidal portions of tributaries in the Town of Topsham, Sagadahoc County and the Town of Brunswick, Cumberland County.

3. Scarborough River. All tidal portions of the Scarborough River and tidal portions of tributaries, the Nonesuch River and tidal portions of tributaries and the tidal marshes known as Scarborough Marsh, all in the Towns of Scarborough, Cumberland County and Old Orchard Beach, York County.’
