RESOLVE, Directing a Study of the Moose Population in Maine.

Study of moose population in Maine. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be directed to make a study to determine the number of moose in Maine and to recommend to the 103rd Legislature the feasibility of having an open season on moose, such feasibility to be based on the results of the study.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

There have been many suggestions that since the moose population in Maine is so large that there should be an open season on moose. The purpose of this resolve is to determine whether or not the facts bear out this assumption.
