**AN ACT Relating to Suspension of Liquor Licenses for Sales of Liquor to
Minors.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 401-A, additional. Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 401-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 401-A. Sales to minors. The Administrative Hearing Commissioner shall suspend the license of any retail licensee who has been found guilty of selling liquor to a minor for a period of 30 days for a first offense, 60 days for a 2nd offense, one year for a 3rd offense and permanently for a subsequent offense.

Pending appeal the decision of the Administrative Hearing Commissioner shall remain in full force and effect.'
