STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Trespass on Unimproved Land Devoted to Preservation of Wildlife.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 3859, additional. Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3859, to read as follows:

'Sec. 3859. Trespass on land devoted to wildlife preservation. Whoever, when armed with any kind of firearm or with bow and arrow, willfully enters upon unimproved land devoted to the preservation of wildlife and owned by a corporation organized under Title 13, chapter 81, and having preservation of wildlife among its purposes, without the permission of the owner thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.'
