AN ACT Relating to Definition of Premises Under Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 16, amended. Subsection 16 of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'16. Premise or premises. "Premise" or "premises," except as otherwise by law specifically designated premises, shall mean and include all rooms interconnected with rooms where the license privilege is exercised in any building occupied by a licensee over which the licensee has direct or indirect control or interest, and shall mean such areas where the license privilege is exercised outside of the licensee's building, which shall be limited to areas over which the licensee has direct or indirect control, and which are within 60 feet of the exterior wall of the building and which are either enclosed or sheltered from the view of the passing public.'
