RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing on Upper Hadlock Pond, Hancock County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary for the conservation of fish for both the inhabitants of Maine and our tourists; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vital to the economy of the State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Ice fishing on Upper Hadlock Pond; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Upper Hadlock Pond, Town of Mount Desert, Hancock County to ice fishing and to prohibit the use or possession of live fish as bait.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
