STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Floyd Merrill of Bath.

Floyd Merrill; pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$60 a month be granted to Floyd Merrill of Bath, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin July 1, 1965 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Floyd Merrill will be 54 years old in May, 1965; is a World War II Veteran, married. He has a bad back and can only work under special supervision and at limited types of work. He lives in a one-room rent with his wife who is partly blind. Floyd Merrill's disability is not serious enough to qualify him for total disability under social security or state's total disability program. Mrs. Merrill has been considered for a state blind pension. So far the medical board has refused to approve her application for aid to the blind.
