STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing Free Hunting and Fishing Licenses and Motor Vehicle Operator Licenses for Persons Seventy Years of Age or Over.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2301, sub-§ 2-A, additional. Section 2301 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 2-A to read as follows:
- '2-A. Free licenses for persons 70 years of age. A license to hunt or fish shall be issued without charge or fee to any resident of Maine who is 70 years of age or over.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 29, § 536-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 536-A to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 536-A. Persons over 70 years of age. On application to the Secretary of State, any Maine resident who is 70 years of age or over and who is otherwise qualified to operate a motor vehicle in this State shall receive a license without the requirement of the payment of any fee.'
