AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Construct Windbreak on Bridge Between Old Town and Indian Island.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the children residing on Indian Island, in crossing the state highway bridge connecting Indian Island with Old Town where they attend school, are subjected to a health and safety hazard because of the severity of weather conditions during the winter months; and

Whereas, funds are needed for the immediate construction of a windbreak on such bridge to protect the children during the current winter months; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation for construction of windbreak on the Old Town-Indian Island bridge. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of constructing a windbreak on the state highway bridge between Old Town and Indian Island in Penobscot County.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
