AN ACT Relating to Trial Terms of Superior Court in Washington County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the operation of the new District Court in Calais will conflict with the use of facilities formerly available to the Superior Court; and

Whereas, the transfer of the June term of Superior Court, held in Calais each year, to Machias is vital if this situation is to be avoided; and

Whereas, the following legislation is necessary if the 1965 term is to be transferred; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4, § 110, sub-§ 15, amended. Subsection 15 of section 110 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'15. **Washington:** At Machias on the 2nd Tuesdays of February, **June** and October ~~and at Calais on the 2nd Tuesday of June.~~'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble this Act shall take effect when approved.
