RESOLVE, Discharging Town of Brooks from Part of the Indebtedness to State for Preparation of Agreement for Dissolution of School Administrative District No. 3.

Town of Brooks discharged from indebtedness to State. Resolved: That all of the indebtedness, exceeding \$2,000, of the Town of Brooks, for reimbursement for the expenses paid by the Maine School District Commission for employment of competent advisers in preparing the agreement of dissolution of School Administrative District No. 3, as provided in the Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 222, is hereby discharged.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Town of Brooks, as a participating municipality of School Administrative District No. 3, petitioned the Maine School District Commission for dissolution of the district. The Maine School District Commission retained a law firm as advisers in preparing the agreement for dissolution, provided under the Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 222. The bill of \$5,095.30 for the firm's services was paid by the Maine School District Commission. The commission, following a negative vote by the participating municipalities on dissolution, claims reimbursement of this amount under Revised Statutes, Title 20, Section 222 from the Town of Brooks. The purpose of this resolve is to discharge the Town of Brooks from part payment.
