STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing for Additional Trial Term in Penobscot County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 4, § 110, sub-§ 10, amended. Subsection 10 of section 110 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- '10. Penobscot: At Bangor on the first Tuesdays of January, April, September and November and the criminal business of said county shall be transacted at the terms held on the first Tuesdays of January, April, June and September, together with civil business. All business having to do with criminal and civil appeal cases, and pending indictments, may be transacted at the June term. All recognizances from the District Court in which parties are held to await the action of the grand jury, made returnable to said April term, shall, when no grand jury is in attendance, be continued to and have day in the next term of the court held in said county.'
