STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications of Candidates for Nomination by Primary Election.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 21, § 443, amended. Section 443 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following new sentences:

‘No candidate will be eligible for any state or county office who has ever been indicted, arrested or fined or sentenced for any crime. This limitation shall not apply to violations of the motor vehicle law.’

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 21, § 445, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 445 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

‘It shall also contain a chronological listing of any and all arrests, indictments and dispositions thereof.’
