**RESOLVE, Providing for Distinctive Name Tags for Members of the
Legislature.**

Name tags for Members of the Legislature. Resolved: That name tags with last name of Legislator viewable at a distance of 10 feet indicating county represented for Senators and town or city represented in the case of Representatives, be made available by the Bureau of Purchases and be worn by all Legislators during the legislative session; and be it further

Resolved: That said name or identification tags be no longer than 4 inches by 3 inches and be worn on the left lapel of jacket worn by male Legislators and one inch below left clavicle on dress, blouse or suit lapel of female Legislators; said identification tags shall be blue for members of the Republican Party and red for members of the Democratic Party; and be it further

Resolved: That members of the 3rd house, at their own expense, wear similar yellow identification tags when circulating in the State House.
