RESOLVE, Providing a Pension for Paul Caron of Wallagrass Plantation.

Paul Caron; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$80 per month is granted to Paul Caron, of Wallagrass Plantation, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1965 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

According to Dr. M. R. Aungst, of Fort Kent, Mr. Caron cannot do any work at the present time because of a fracture of the great toe. He also will not be able to do any amount of work because of a spinal condition. A pressure of his nerve causes pain of his biceps. About 6 weeks' time should be allowed for the fracture to heal, then Mr. Caron would be able to do some light work for only about one day a week. It is the opinion of the doctor that Mr. Caron could be considered totally disabled. Mr. Caron has a wife and child to support.
