STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Purse Seines in Taking Herring from Certain Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 3856-A, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3856-A to read as follows:

'Sec. 3856-A. Purse seines in taking herring. It is unlawful to take herring by use of purse seines inside and northwesterly of a line drawn as follows: Commencing at Adams Head on Richmond Island, Cumberland County, thence in a northeasterly direction to Dyer Point on Cape Elizabeth, thence in a northerly direction to Ram Island Light, thence in an easterly direction to Outer Green Island, thence in an easterly, northeasterly direction to Dunkers Ledge, thence in an easterly direction to the southernmost point of Small Point, Sagadahoc County. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the use of purse seines used in taking herring which have been caught by use of stop seines.'
