## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Certain Expenses of Supreme Judicial Court Paid by State to Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 56, amended. Section 56 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 56. Messenger in Cumberland County. Any justice of the Supreme Judicial Court residing in Cumberland County may appoint a messenger who shall receive an annual salary of \$3,000 in full compensation for service and attendance to be paid from the county treasury by the State.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 4, § 1056, additional. Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1056 to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 1056. Rent for Supreme Judicial Court in Cumberland County. There shall be paid to Cumberland County by the State the sum of \$200 monthly as rental for the sessions of the Supreme Judicial Court in Cumberland County.'
- **Sec. 3. Appropriation.** There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$4,050 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$5,400 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
