COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 591, L.D. 783, Bill, "An Act
Revising the Laws Relating to Plumbers."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section 2, a new
section, as follows:

"Sec. 3. R. S., T. 32, §3502, amended. Section 3502 of
Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
'§3502. Examination.

Each applicant for license shall present to the executive
officer of the board on blanks furnished by the board, a written
application for examination and license, containing such infor-
mation as the board may require, accompanied by the fee provided
for in sections 3503 and 3505. Examinations shall be in whole
or in part in writing and shall be of a thorough and practical
character, but shall not include the wiping of lead joints. They
shall cover the theoretical and practical nature of plumbing and
such branches thereof as the board may deem necessary."

Further amend said Bill, in section 3, by inserting after
the underlined word and punctuation "year," in the 5th line
the underlined words 'or has had equivalent training in the
armed services for at least one year'; and by adding at the
end of said section 3, before the single quotation mark, the
following underlined sentence:
'Time served out of the State or in the armed services for less
than one year as herein provided shall be creditable in com-
pleting the one-year requirement herein provided.'

Further amend said Bill, in section 5, by adding at the end,
before the single quotation mark, the following underlined
sentence:
'Time served out of the State or in the armed services for less
than one year as herein provided shall be creditable in com-
pleting the one-year requirement herein provided.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering sections 3 to 8 to
be sections 4 to 9, respectively.
